Dr Panagiotis Ferentinos received his Medical Degree from the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens (NKUA), he has specialized in Psychiatry and completed his sabbatical training in Psychiatric Genetics (Statistical Genetics and Bioinformatics) and Psychopharmacology of Affective Disorders at the Institute of Psychiatry, Psychology and Neuroscience, King's College London, where he has been to date an affiliated research associate. He currently serves as Associate Professor of Psychiatry at the 2nd Department of Psychiatry, NKUA, Attikon University Hospital, where he heads the Affective Disorders & Suicide inpatient unit and outpatient clinic as well as a special Group Psychoeducation Clinic for patients with bipolar disorder.

His teaching work at undergraduate and postgraduate levels focuses on Psychiatry, Psychopharmacology, Neuropsychiatry and Psychiatric Genetics. His research work lies in the fields of Affective Disorders & Self-destructive Behavior (Psychopathology, Psychometrics, Neuropsychology, Neuroimaging, Psychiatric Genetics, Psychopharmacology, Meta-analysis) and Neuropsychiatry. He participates in multicenter genetic and pharmacogenetic studies in patients with affective disorders (European Group for the Study of Resistant Depression- funded pharmacogenetic study of resistant depression, Psychiatric Genetics Consortium-Bipolar Disorder, Ubiquitous Pharmacogenomics (UPGx)/PREPARE- international multicenter pharmacoeconomic study of pharmacogenetically guided psychiatric pharmacotherapy, ConLigen- international pharmacogenetic study of bipolar disorder patients' response to lithium) and in international consortia of meta-analyses (DEPRESSD- meta-analysis of the psychometric behavior of the HADS scale, MHCOVID- meta-analysis of the psychosocial effects of the COVID pandemic). He has received 2 Maria Zaousi awards from the Hellenic Psychiatric Association (for publications on bipolar disorder) and 8 poster awards at Greek and international conferences.

His published research work includes (1/2/2023) 105 publications in the PubMed database with a total Impact Factor of 644.5, 1479 citations in the Scopus database (h-index 20) and 2451 citations in the Google Scholar database (h-index 26) as well as 4 chapters in foreign language books, 17 chapters in Greek collaborative books as well as over 200 abstracts or presentations at international and Greek scientific conferences. Finally, he is a member of the editorial board (associate editor) of 3 scientific journals (BMC Psychiatry, Frontiers in Psychiatry, Psychiatriki) and a reviewer in 45 international scientific journals.
